

Salvation is Only in the Lord

(Exodus 14:27-31)

Introduction:

1. Reading and studying the Old Testament not only provides you with history and stories to live by, it provides you with “shadows” of the New Testament.
 - a. Shadows of the church (Daniel 2:44).
 - b. Shadows of the Savior (Isaiah 53).
2. (Romans 15:4)

I. The Exodus from Egypt

- A. The power of God was shown at the beginning (Exodus 13:21).
- B. Pharaoh seeks revenge (Exodus 14:1-10).
- C. The nation of Israel turns to Moses for answers (Exodus 14:11-12).
- D. Moses tells the nation that they will see “the salvation of the Lord.” (Exodus 14:13)

II. The Salvation of the Israelites

- A. Notice who was fighting for the Israelites (Exodus 14:14).
 1. The Lord would be the one to accomplish the great feat. (Exodus 14:13).
- B. The power of God was still shown to the Israelites even though they thought of turning back (Exodus 14:19).
- C. The Red Sea has not been dry since (Exodus 14:20).
 1. The walls of water that saved the Israelites, crushed the Egyptians (Exodus 14:23-28).
- D. Who saved Israel? (Exodus 14:30)
 1. It was God’s power that saved the children of Israel not their own.
 2. (Exodus 14:31)

III. Today is the Day of Salvation

- A. (2 Corinthians 6:1-2)
- B. The Israelites were saved by the power of God (Exodus 14:13, 30).
- C. Today you can be saved by the power of God (2 Corinthians 6:1-2; Romans 1:16).
 1. “Salvation belongs to the Lord” (Psalms 3:8).
 2. “Our God is the God of salvation” (Psalms 68:20).
 3. “I will joy in the God of my salvation” (Habakkuk 3:18).
- D. You are saved by Christ (Acts 4:12; John 3:16).
 1. Christ is the author of eternal salvation (Hebrews 5:9).
- E. How does one get in Christ?
 1. (Galatians 3:27)
 2. How did those in the early church, the body of Christ (Ephesians 1:22,23) obey?
 - a. They heard (Romans 10:17),
 - b. They believed (Mark 16:16),
 - c. They repented (Acts 2:38),
 - d. They confessed (Acts 8:37),
 - e. They were immersed into water (baptism) (Acts 2:38; 8:38,39).
